NOTES FROM THE PRESIDENT

How exciting to see Denmark win 11 medals at the Tokyo Olympics—3 Gold, 4 Silver, and 4 Bronze! And all were celebrated! So much fun.

Now that the Olympics are behind us for a year, the DAC is facing a new season of uncertainty. Over the summer we made plans to reopen our building and schedule programs hoping that the pandemic was behind us. Now we are back to wearing masks in many indoor settings whether we are vaccinated or not. BEGINNING DANISH COURSE STARTS SEPT. 18

The September book selection is Danish author Christian Jungersen's 2004 award-winning *The Exception* (*Undtagelsen*, 502 pages, translated in 2006 by Anna Paterson). Discussion leader will be Gitte Mohr.

The book has been published in 18 countries and adapted for Radio 4. It was on the bestseller list for 1.5 years in Denmark and has twice been at or near the top of readers' polls (2009 second best Danish novel of past 25 years in Jyllands-Posten and 2010 as best Danish novel of preceding decade). It won the P2 Novel Prize and *De Gyldne Laurbær* and was nominated for the International Dublin Literary Award, the Duncan Lawrie Dagger (UK), the Gran Prix des Lectrices de Elle (France), and the Martin Beck Award (Sweden).

According to the book jacket, "The Exception dissects the nature of evil and the paranoia that drives ordinary people to commit unthinkable acts. Four women work together for a small non-profit in Copenhagen that disseminates information on genocide. When two of them receive death threats, they immediately believe that they are being stalked by Miro Zigic, the Serbian torturer and war criminal they recently profiled in their articles. Yet as tensions mount among the women, their suspicions turn away from Zigic and toward each other. The threats increase, and soon the office becomes a battlefield in which each woman's move is suspect."

In a very readable translation, the novel unfolds in chapters alternating among the four co-workers at the Danish Center for Genocide Information: Anne-Lise, Camilla, Iben, and Malene. Drawing on research on the nature of evil, Jungersen's thriller makes the case that the same dark impulses that lead to genocide may underlie the bullying that plagues the dysfunctional center's office – and be present in all humans (adapted from Wikipedia). *New York* magazine described it as "full of surprises and profound moral implications....ends with a devastating twist."

The fall sessions continue on October 17 with *The Red Address Book* by Sweden's Sofia Lundberg (2017, 290 pages; translated by Alice Menzies) and on November 21 with the Danish classic *The Fall of the King* by Johannes V. Jensen (1901, 273 pages; translated by Alan G. Bower). During the fall, the group will also receive and vote on the list of books nominated for 2022. Many thanks to Mary Beth Lake for compiling the suggestions made by members.
