## **NOTES FROM THE PRESIDENT**

Godt nytår! As I write this, I'm celebrating the holidays with my family, and reflecting on the events of the past year.

We celebrated a wonderful Julefrokost in December. As is tradition, the food was excellent, and the program was fun and happy. So wonderful to see so many delighted faces enjoying this traditional gathering. Many thanks to the volunteers who prepared the food, organized the program, and performed countless tasks behind the scenes. You are all much appreciated.

We received an unexpected and very welcome gift from the City of Minneapolis last month. Shortly before the Julefrokost, the City of Minneapolis notified us that the city liquor laws have been amended. The new amendment allows nonprofit organizations like ours to apply for temporary liquor permits without needing a sponsoring partner organization to fulfill the insurance requirement.

As it stands now, we are able to apply for our own liquor permits (up to 12 days per year), with some enhanced requirements.



For example, we are required to purchase a temporary liquor liability insurance policy for each event at which we wish to serve alcohol. Among other requirements, we must also use trained serving staff (many of our DAC volunteers already have this service training). This is a very positive step forward for our DAC events where we want to offer alcohol drink service.

So, what does this mean going forward? We are again free to schedule many of the traditional events that involve alcohol service. Danish Day and Julefrokost are among these events. This change in the city's amendments also allows us to consider holding the Aquavit pairing meal again.

I am grateful that the city changed this rule for nonprofits, and I am grateful for all of you for making 2025 a wonderful year of celebration and happiness at DAC.

## DANEBO READING CIRCLE BEGINS 2026 BY ISLAND HOPPING

Sunday, January 18: 1-3pm

The first two books for 2026 take Reading Circle participants to two iconic islands with deep ties to Denmark: Iceland and Greenland. Everyone is welcome to join the journeys.

The Danebo Reading Circle convenes 1-3pm on the third Sunday of meeting months, which is typically an Æbleskive Breakfast day. There will always be a Zoom option in addition to the onsite meeting in the third-floor North Commons at the DAC. The list of the eight 2026 books appeared in the December DANews. Bookmarks with the full schedule are available at meetings and on the table outside the DAC Library.

On Sunday, January 18, the group will discuss a well-known Icelandic saga about Njál (Burnt-Njál): *Njál's Saga* (*Brennu-Njáls Saga*) by an unknown author (IS); 1270, 418pp; translated into English by Robert Cook for Penguin Classics, 1960. The book is available in print at Magers & Quinn bookstore in Minneapolis, and also in print, eBook, and audio formats online. Two titles are the same book: *Njál's Saga* and *The Story/Saga of Burnt Njál*.

Discussion leaders in January are Suzanne Jebe and Michelle Potter-Bacon. Invited guests include members of the Icelandic Hekla Club, who meet at the DAC and sponsored the stunning Njál's Saga Tapestry Exhibit last August. Photos of the exhibit will be part of the discussion.

From one bookseller comes this description of Njál's Saga: "Written in the 13th century, it is a story that explores perennial human problems – from failed marriages to divided loyalties, from the law's inability to curb human passions to the terrible consequences when decent men and women are swept up in a tide of violence beyond their control. It is populated by memorable and complex characters like Gunnar of Hlidarendi, a powerful warrior with an aversion to killing, and the not-so-villanous Mord Valgardsson. Full of dreams, strange prophecies, violent power struggles, and fragile peace agreements, Njál's Saga tells the compelling story of a fifty-year blood feud that, despite its distance from us in time and place, is driven by passions familiar to us all." – Amazon.com

For the February 15, 2026 meeting, the selection is The

*Fish Can Sing* by Halldór Laxness (*Brekkukotsannáll*), (IS); 1957, 288 pages; translated into English by Magnus Magnusson, 2000, Harvill Press. The story, set at the start of the 20th century, is about orphaned Álfgrímur, his adoptive grandparents, and the small, tolerant community of misfits and eccentrics on the outskirts of Reykjavik. As a coming-of-age tale, it is Laxness's most beloved novel. The orphan Álfgrímur wants to become a lumpfisherman in his fishing village, but he becomes enthralled by its most famous citizen, an opera singer named Garder Holm. Álfgrímur has to find his own path without turning his back on where he came from.

Current, former, and new members are always welcome to meet with the group at the DAC or via Zoom. Newcomers may attend the first meeting without commitment, but continuation requires DAC membership. With some days seeming endlessly dark and cold, it's a great time to find a new hobby with books from the DAC library. Check out one of our whittling books, or get cozy making Nordic-patterned mittens or a sweater. Sharpen the scissors and test your skill with one of our "how-to" paper-cut books (English or Danish language).

Or, for a cosy read, I recommend Amulya Malladi's books. *The Sound of Language* (an Afghani widow navigates Denmark's refugee system), and books 1 and 2 in her Gabriel Præst, Copenhagen private eye, series. We also have new books by Icelandic author Auður Ava Ólafsdóttir; two in a developing series by Satu Rämö, and several books by Norwegian Lars Mytting, including his historical fiction mysteries, the Sister Bells Trilogy.

Prerequisite Danish Beginners 1, a language course using the textbook *Colloquial Danish* for adult learners.
